Sauvignon Blanc 2006

Neil and Francine were seeking a new home, a place to anchor their lives and dreams, a hub for the gathering of family and friends. They planted a small vineyard to complement their renovation of the villa and property as well. They hired winemaker Seth Kunin, one of the wine industry's rising stars. Sourcing fruit from select estate vineyard blocks, Seth guides each Westerly wine by hand, articulating the natural flavors and personality of the fruit while enhancing its complexity through artful winemaking. Their Sauvignon Blanc vines occupy a high-elevation block, where consistent sun exposure and Pacific breezes guide the fruit to optimal maturity, with fully defined flavors and crisp varietal acidity.

Today, Saintsbury's viticultural and winemaking adventures are tied to their belief in particular Carneros vineyards that have proven to be the source of outstanding grapes. They've also dedicated production to fruit just a few miles north in the Anderson Valley making high quality Pinots from great Burgundy Clones. Cerise is a steep hillside vineyard facing west and southwest overlooking the town of Booneville. From a perch about 900 feet above the floor of the Anderson Valley the vines form a patchwork of vineyard blocks planted to Pommard and Dijon clones of Pinot Noir. low yield vintages like 2005 provide uncommon concentration and intensity with the broad sweet middle of the wine hung on a muscular framework of sweet tannins.

The winery was founded in 1972 by a group of lawyers and doctors from San Francisco who decided to try turning their passion for wine into a business. However, their dream was short-lived and in 1975, they sold Franciscan to Raymond Duncan and Justin Meyer, business and winemaking partners who also owned Silver Oak. In 1985 Agustin Huneeus, a Chilean exile who had built Concha y Toro in his native country, took over the helm at Franciscan. His influences led to the introduction in 1987 of Napa Valley's first 100% wild-yeast fermented Chardonnay—Cuvée Sauvage. A notable old world tradition in Burgundy, many Californians thought fermenting with a vineyard's own native yeasts could not be done here.

The first Hardin Cabernet Sauvignon (2003) was discovered by Doug Polaner, New York based wine importer, on a trip to California. The wine was sourced from one of Napa Valley's long time "cult" producers. Doug found himself in Napa at the right time, and was able to taste and buy a small lot of this top, top quality wine and blend his own quality product. Doug traveled throughout Napa tasting small lots of Cabernet until he was able to assemble the right combination of components. The 2004 is a blend of 81% Cabernet Sauvignon, 17% Merlot and 2% Petit Verdot. The wine was aged in 75% new French oak for 18 months before being racked into used oak. Stylistically, the wine is classic deep, plush Napa Cab with lots of ripe Cassis fruit, sweet tannins and hints of (super quality) oak.
